

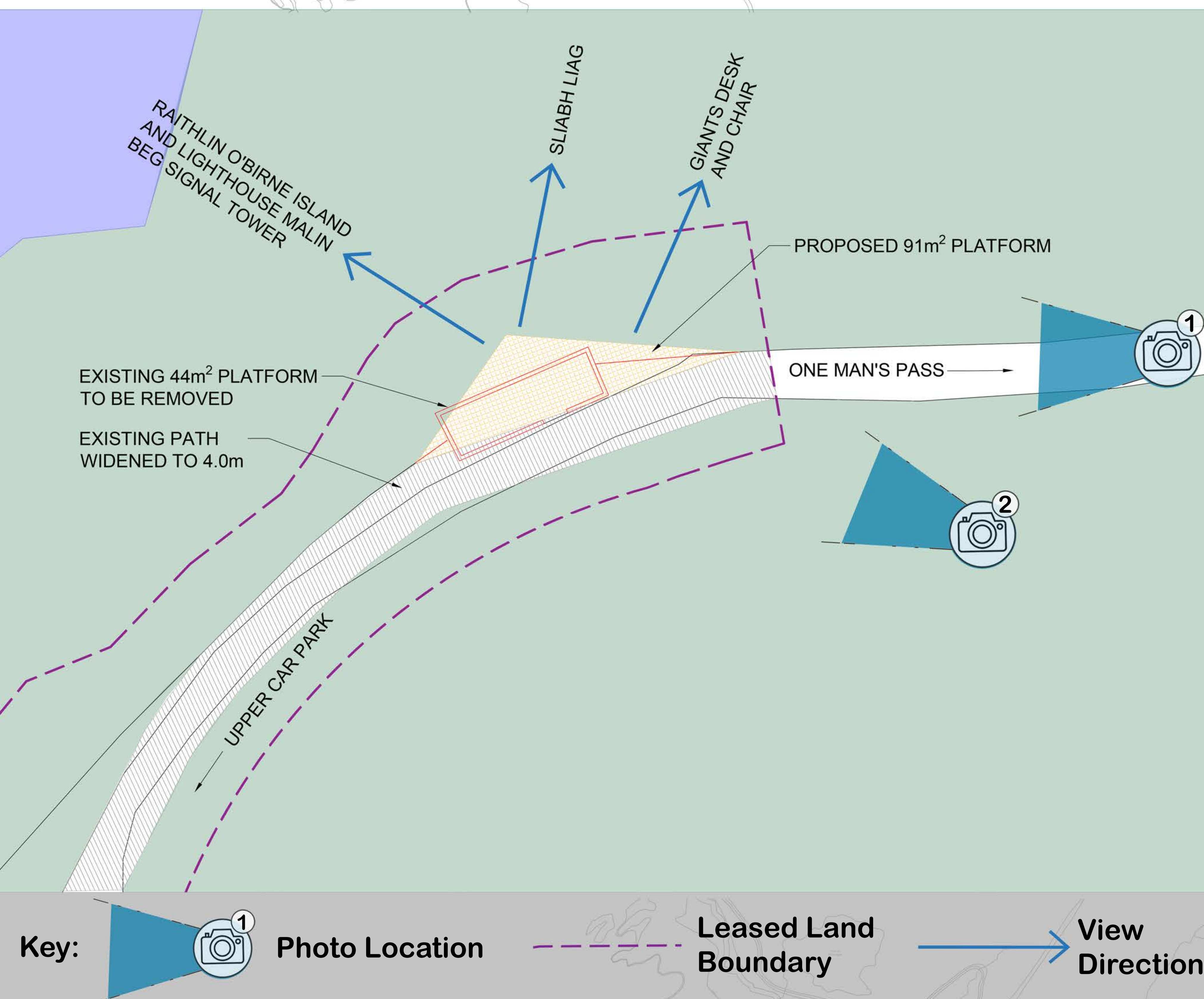
SLIABH LIAG VIEWING PLATFORM NON-STATUTORY PUBLIC CONSULTATION



Sliabh Liag is one of the tallest cliffsides in Europe, reaching 601m high over the Atlantic Ocean. This attraction is popular among tourists visiting Donegal and it remains the top attraction visited within the county. Sliabh Liag is also listed as one of the Discovery Points along the Wild Atlantic Way.

The existing viewing platform, located along the Sliabh Liag View Walk does not currently reach visitor expectations. The viewing platform is a small timber structure, which requires consistent maintenance to ensure it remains operational. Donegal County Council, in conjunction with the Sliabh Liag Company, aims to improve the visitor experience at Sliabh Liag.

Sliabh Liag would benefit from a well designed viewing platform which achieves a safer and more comfortable experience for all users enabling them to appreciate the natural beauty of the area. Any replacement platform will require consideration of the material and form to minimise impact on the highly sensitive environment and ensure efficient management of the area. Funding for this scheme has been secured from Fáilte Ireland under the Shared Island Programme for Government. From the platform, visitors can view the surrounding points of interest, and the overall face of the cliffside, providing one of the most scenic views within Donegal.



As part of the scheme development, a **Non-Statutory Public Consultation** is now being carried out to allow members of the public an opportunity to review the proposed scheme and raise any comments.
